## Director of Housing & Support Services – Cascade AIDS Project

**Description:** We are at a crossroads in the fight against HIV/AIDS, and there has never been a more hopeful time to join the fight. Although HIV/AIDS has fallen from the headlines, the epidemic is far from over. In fact, an individual in the US is infected with HIV every 9.5 minutes. Youth, ages 19-24 are rising in new infections, and it is estimated that 1 in 30 Black/African American Women and 1 in 16 Black/African American Men will be diagnosed with HIV in their lifetime. Locally, more Oregonians are living with HIV/AIDS today than ever before and it is estimated that up to 20% of Oregonians living with HIV/AIDS don't know it. With statistics like these why are we so hopeful? A recent National Institutes of Health study demonstrated that if we can diagnose and notify people who are HIV-positive and get them engaged and to remain in care, we can reduce the ongoing HIV transmission by 96%! This is how we will usher in an AIDS-free generation. HIV testing, linkage to care, and support programs like housing and care services will play a vital role in making this a reality for Oregonians. Cascade AIDS Project (CAP) is looking for the next dynamic and visionary leader to serve as the Director of Housing & Support Services to help us meet our mission and end HIV/AIDS.

CAP is the oldest and largest provider of HIV prevention, education, housing, advocacy and support services in Oregon and Southwest Washington. Full-time and exempt, the Director of Housing & Support Services reports to the Executive Director and provides oversight and direction for all housing and support services programs serving people who are living with or affected by HIV/AIDS. CAP provides supportive housing services to 700 people living with HIV and provides support services to an additional 1,300 people annually, including employment skills, life skills workshops, and services that assist individual who are newly diagnosed or who need additional assistance to maintain their medical care through our patient navigation programs. Housing and Support Services also offers youth and family programs including a one-week residential camp for kids who are infected or affected by HIV/AIDS. These programs provide the necessary support to assist people living with HIV/AIDS get linked into care and remain in care.

The Director of Housing & Support Services manages a department budget of \$3 million that include federal, state, county, city and private grants; directly supervises three managers and one union-represented staff; and oversees a team of 28 staff including 22 union-represented staff. The ideal candidate will have a Master's degree and at least five years of experience working in a non-profit setting with management experience and a proven track record of success in nonprofit programs.
